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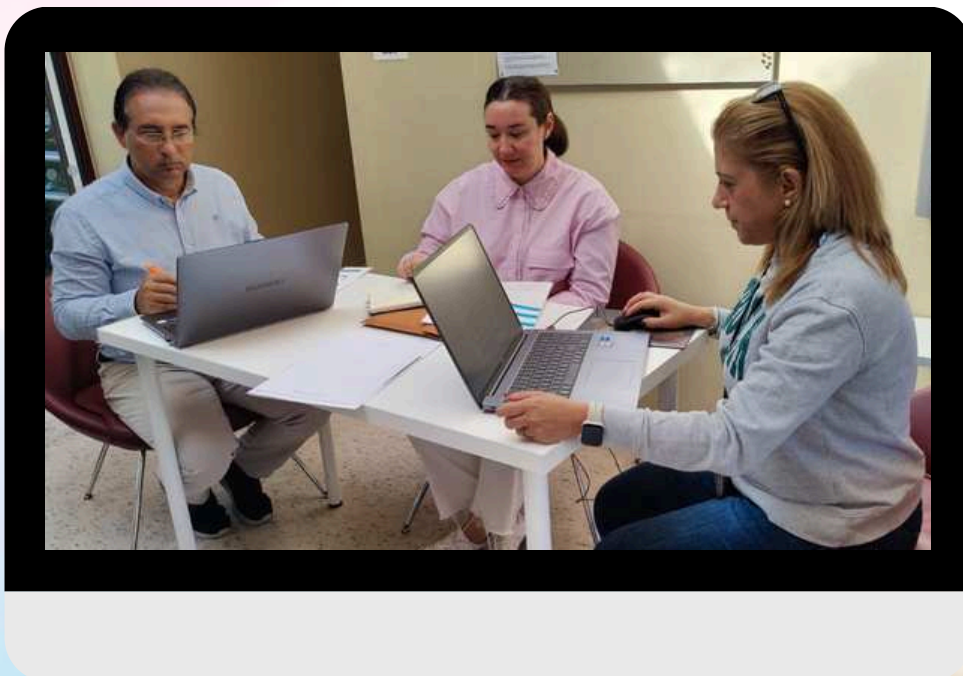
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Meeting highlights

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Activity 2 WORKSHOPS FOR TEACHERS

As part of our second project activity, Co-ART workshops were successfully rolled out in Spain and Ireland, reaching over 90 teachers across nine schools. Educators explored five creative activities from the Co-ART Guide, such as the Shared Story Game and Role Play, to boost communication, teamwork, and student engagement.

Both countries reported outstanding results: teachers felt more confident, students more involved, and classrooms more dynamic. The games not only worked well—they sparked new ideas and practices that teachers were excited to adapt and expand.
